

NEW STUDENT STEPS

	STEP 1: Log in to MyJJC
	MyJJC is your one-stop-shop for access to important information like your class schedule, financial aid, deadlines and more.
•	Your MyJJC account is created 24-72 hours after applying to JJC.
•	Look up your MyJJC username, ID #, email and create your MyJJC password at jjc.edu/password.
☐ s	TEP 2: Make sure JJC has your placement records (if applicable)
	If you have a high enough ACT or SAT score, you may not need placement testing. If you took the ACT or SAT, you must make a request for the testing company to submit your scores to JJC. Your PSAT or high school GPA may also excuse you from placement testing. Check out our temporary alternative measures to see if you qualify at jjc.edu/placement. If you do not have any of these scores, you will need to take placement testing (see Step 6).
☐ s	TEP 3: Make sure JJC has your high school transcript or equivalency record
	The JJC Admissions Office must have your high school transcript or equivalency record, as well as all of your eligible test scores.
	Ask your high school to email these records to admissions@jjc.edu or mail them to: ATTN: Admissions, 1215 Houbolt Rd., Joliet, IL 60435
☐ STEP 4: Submit earned college credit (if applicable)	
•	If you earned credit from another college or university, through Advanced Placement (AP) or through College- Level Examination Program (CLEP) credit, email your official college transcripts to transfercredit@jjc.edu. If you want your credits to be evaluated and added to your JJC record, you must complete a Transfer Credit Evaluation Form
□ s	TEP 5: Complete the New Student Presentation

STEP 6: Complete JJC Placement Exams (if applicable)

- Placement scores are mandatory for enrollment into English, math and other classes.
- If you are not exempt (see Step 2), then you are required to take a JJC placement exam.
- Visit jjc.edu/testing or jjc/edu/placement to fill out a request form for testing.

STEP 7: Complete the FAFSA and apply for scholarships (if applicable)

- Complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.edu.gov
- · Apply for scholarships at jjc/edu/scholarships.

■ STEP 8: Meet with an advisor

- In your virtual advisor meeting, you can discuss placement scores, your chosen program requirements, creating a class schedule, how to use JJC technology and how to register.

☐ STEP 9: Register for Classes

• If you didn't register for your first semester of classes during your advising session, you can do so on your own via MyJJC.

STEP 10: Pay for classes (if applicable)

IMPORTANT DATES

Students can complete steps anytime within the application period. Students are eligible to enroll in classes after the suggested dates, but course availability may be limited.

- Application available: Oct. 1, 2021 March 31, 2022
- Complete the New Student Presentation (online): October to November
- Placement Testing (or submit appropriate scores): October to November
- · Sign up for Advising: October to November
- Registration for Spring semester begins Oct. 18, 2021
- · Tuition due: Dec. 6, 2021
- Financial Aid Priority Date: Nov. 22, 2021
- · Spring semester begins week of Jan. 17, 2022

Summer 2022 Classes (May Start)

- · Application available: Oct. 1, 2021 July 31, 2022
- · Complete the New Student Presentation (online): October to February
- · Placement Testing (or submit appropriate scores): October to March
- · Sign up for an Advising: February to May
- · Registration for Summer sessions begins March 21, 2022
- Tuition due: May 9, 2022
- · Financial Aid Priority Date: April 25, 2002
- · Summer Session I begins: May 23, 2022
- Summer Session II begins: June 6, 2022
- · Summer Session III begins: July 5, 2022

Fall 2022 Classes (August Start)

- · Application available: Oct. 1, 2021 to Oct. 30, 2022
- · Complete the New Student Presentation (online): January to April
- · Placement Testing (or submit appropriate scores): January to April
- · Sign up for Advising: February July
- · Registration for Fall Semester begins April 25, 2022
- · Tuition due: July 25, 2022
- · Financial Aid Priority Date: July 11, 2022
- · Fall semester begins: Aug. 22, 2022
